HOW TO WAGER, ACG STYLE

Win a new referral partner. Place in front of the right investor. Show up and let the room do the rest. You don't need a program to know a good bet when you see one.

HOW TO WAGER

1. BEFORE YOU BET

Pickup a free program when you arrive, or find one online the day before. Video boards around the grounds count down the Minutes To Post (MTP) for the next race, so you'll know how long you have to decide. Each horse wears a saddle towel with its post position number, which matches its listing in the program. Bring a pen. Regulars always do.

2. HOW TO BET

Walkup to a teller window with cash or a voucher and tell them three things, in order:

1. The track and race number
2. The dollar amount and type of wager
3. The number of the horse or horses you want

Something like: "Del Mar, race four, two dollars to win on number five." Hold onto the ticket. That's your proof if you win.

3. THE BASICS

Start simple. These three bets cover a single horse in a single race:

Win — your horse finishes first.

Place — your horse finishes first or second.

Show — your horse finishes first, second, or third.

Want to hedge? An Across the Board bet places all three at once on a single horse.

4. LEVEL UP: EXOTIC WAGERS

Exacta — pick the first two finishers, in exact order.

Trifecta — pick the first three finishers, in exact order.

Superfecta — pick the first four finishers, in exact order.

Confident in your horses but not their order? You can box any of these so they can finish in any order. It costs more, but it forgives a guess.

5. MULTI-RACE WAGERS

Rolling Double — winners of two races back to back.

Pick Three / Four / Five / Six — winners of three, four, five, or six consecutive races on the card.

Super High Five — the toughest of the bunch: the first five finishers of a single race, in exact order.

6. CASHING IN

Your payout depends on the final odds posted on the board, not the odds printed in the morning program. A \$2 win bet at 3-to-1 odds pays out \$8 total, your \$6 in winnings plus your original \$2 back. Bet more than the \$2 base and the payout scales right along with it.

1/2	\$3.00
1/1	\$4.00
3/2	\$5.00
2/1	\$6.00
6/1	\$14.00
10/1	\$22.00

Winning tickets can be cashed at a self-service machine or teller window. No rush, uncashed tickets are typically good for months after the meet ends.

TRACK TALK: A QUICK GLOSSARY

Pari-mutuel — you're betting against other bettors, not the house. The track takes a commission and splits the rest of the pool among winning tickets, so odds shift as people wager.

Morning Line — the odds printed in the program before the races start, a prediction of how the public will bet.

Watch the boards for the real, live odds.

Past Performance — a horse's recent race history: finishes, distances, tracks, and times.

Post Time — when a race is set to start.

Scratch — a horse pulled from a race after entries close.

Voucher — a printed credit slip from a cash deposit, spendable on more bets or cashable at the window.
