The Chair and Co-Chairs are integral parts to ACG DFW as we have 13 committees that participate in a wide range of activities. The leaders set the precedent by steering the committee and its goals from June 1, 2018-May 31, 2019.

Typically, the Chair is responsible for the following:

- Select a Co-Chair
- Establish committee members for the year
- Schedule quarterly meetings, two in person (minimum of 6 for programs and membership)
- Meeting agenda sent day prior to meeting

- Attend events
