Alexandra Rebay recently retired from Verizon Communications after over 20 years, where she was the Senior Vice President, Deputy General Counsel and Global Chief Compliance Officer for the Corporation. During her tenure at Verizon, Ms. Rebay designed, built, led, implemented and managed the company's global compliance program, which included enterprise-wide risk assessments and mitigation initiatives, quarterbacking internal investigations, and regular interactions with law enforcement, regulatory authorities and Verizon's Board of Directors. Earlier in her career at Verizon, Ms. Rebay also managed the company's significant litigation matters.

Since retiring from Verizon on the eve of the Covid-19 Pandemic, Ms. Rebay has deployed her expertise in compliance, risk-management, litigation and crisis management to focus on advising and guiding not-for-profit entities – in particular the Greater Somerset County YMCA whose Board she chairs – in working through the myriad novel operational issues presented by the global Pandemic and its aftermath.

For her work on several terrorist prosecutions, including the 1993 World Trade Center Bombings and the Seditious Conspiracy Plot to bomb various New York City landmarks, Ms. Rebay received the Attorney General's Award for Exceptional Service (the Justice Department's highest honor). Ms. Rebay also served as the U.S. Attorney's Office's Chief Appellate Attorney, the Chief of the Special Narcotics Investigations Unit, and the coordinator of the Organized Crime Drug Enforcement Task Force for the New York/New Jersey Region.

Before becoming a federal prosecutor, Ms. Rebay served as law clerk to the Honorable Anthony M. Kennedy on the 9th Circuit Court of Appeals (prior to his elevation to the U.S. Supreme Court), and worked at a Manhattan law firm.

Ms. Rebay graduated from Barnard College with a degree in Russian language and literature, and received her law degree from Columbia Law School. She speaks French, Italian, Russian and Spanish.
